

9. **Objections.** Objections to entries or awards must be made in writing within one hour of the completion of the judging of the Class or Special concerned, accompanied by a deposit of £25 for each protest. The Chief Horse/Pony Steward will investigate the matter and their decision shall be final.
10. **Stewards - Power to enforce Regulations.** The Committee delegates full power to the Chief Steward to enforce the Society's Rules and Regulations.
11. **Exhibitors Vehicles.** All vehicles must be parked at the places provided and must not under any circumstances be left in stock lines or other avenues. All entries are accepted on the understanding that this instruction will be complied with.
12. **Entries at Members Rates.** Exhibitors who are not Members of the Society may make entries at Members rates by paying their 2010 subscription at the time of entry. The annual subscriptions are Single Membership £25.00 inc. VAT: Joint Membership £40.00 inc. VAT.
13. **Exhibitors' Passes.** One day passes will be issued in relation to numbers of entries made as follows:- (These will be in addition to Members passes).
 1 Horse - 2 one day passes 4 Horses - 4 one day passes
 2 Horses - 3 one day passes 5 Horses - 4 one day passes
 3 Horses - 3 one day passes 6 Horses - 5 one day passes
 Extra passes at a special pre-Show price may be purchased at time of entry.
14. **Working In Areas.** All horses and ponies must work-in in the area provided.
15. **Hats.** Anyone riding a horse or pony must wear a hard hat of a standard approved by the governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting. All hats must be properly fastened.
16. **Dogs.** All dogs must be kept on a lead and under proper control at all times.
17. **Interpretation of the Rules and Regulations.** The Society reserves to itself by its Committee the sole and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations or any other prescribed Conditions arbitrarily to settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show. Also to refuse or to cancel any entries, to postpone or abandon the Show and relax conditions as the Society may deem expedient.
18. **Entries.** All entries must be made on the Official Entry Form together with the full Entry Fees. No telephone entries will be accepted. Under no circumstances will Entry Fees be refunded in case of cancellation of entries by an exhibitor.
19. **Breed Society Rules.** All persons entering, competing or exhibiting an animal in a class covered by a Breed Society either to which Staffordshire County Show is affiliated or which is affiliated to Staffordshire County Show shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed Society and shall be subject to its constitution and rules (including any disciplinary procedures)
20. **Use of Rings.** Strictly no warming up in any Showing Ring. Collecting Rings must be used for this purpose. Anyone infringing this rule will be disqualified and no refund of entry fees made.

- Stables.** No stables are available on the Showground. Competitors may contact any of the following yards and make their own arrangements. It should be understood that Staffordshire and Birmingham Agricultural Society accept no responsibility for any stabling arrangements competitors may make.
