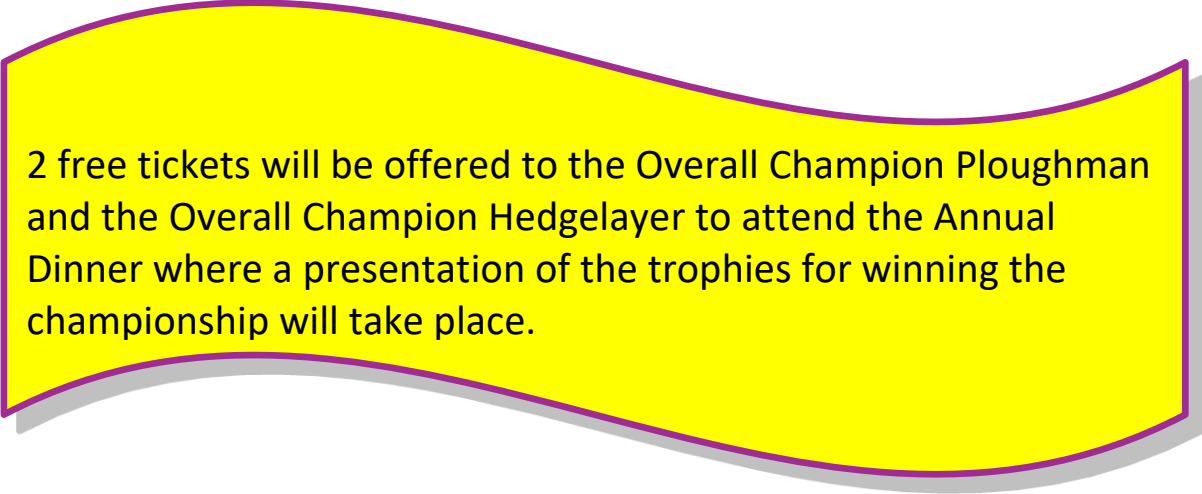

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COUNTY NOVICE PLOUGHING CHAMPIONSHIP

JUDGE: Mr T Parton, South Staffs District

Open to any competitor at a District Ploughing Match who has never won a first prize in any ploughing class at any ploughing match.

Any Competitor wishing to be judged for the Novice Championship must indicate on the entry form for the district ploughing match that he or she is eligible.

RULES:

1. Entry to the County Novice Championship will be via the relevant District Ploughing Match entry form and will be limited to reversible classes
2. A novice is defined as someone who has never won a Class, including a Young Farmers Class or Novice Championship, at any ploughing match. However, winning a class in a Ploughing Match held after 1st September 2026 would not debar the competitor from entering the County Novice Championship.
3. Each District will identify the novices at their Ploughing Match that have entered the County Novice Championship: The County Judge will then award points to each of the competitors based on their finished work
4. On completion of all the District Ploughing Matches the County Judge will rank all competitors based on the number of points he has awarded at the individual District Matches, prizes will be awarded to competitors ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd.
5. A competitor may enter the County Novice Championship as many times as he or she wishes by entering more than one District Ploughing Match.
6. Competitors must live within the County of Staffordshire or within 10 miles of the County Boundary

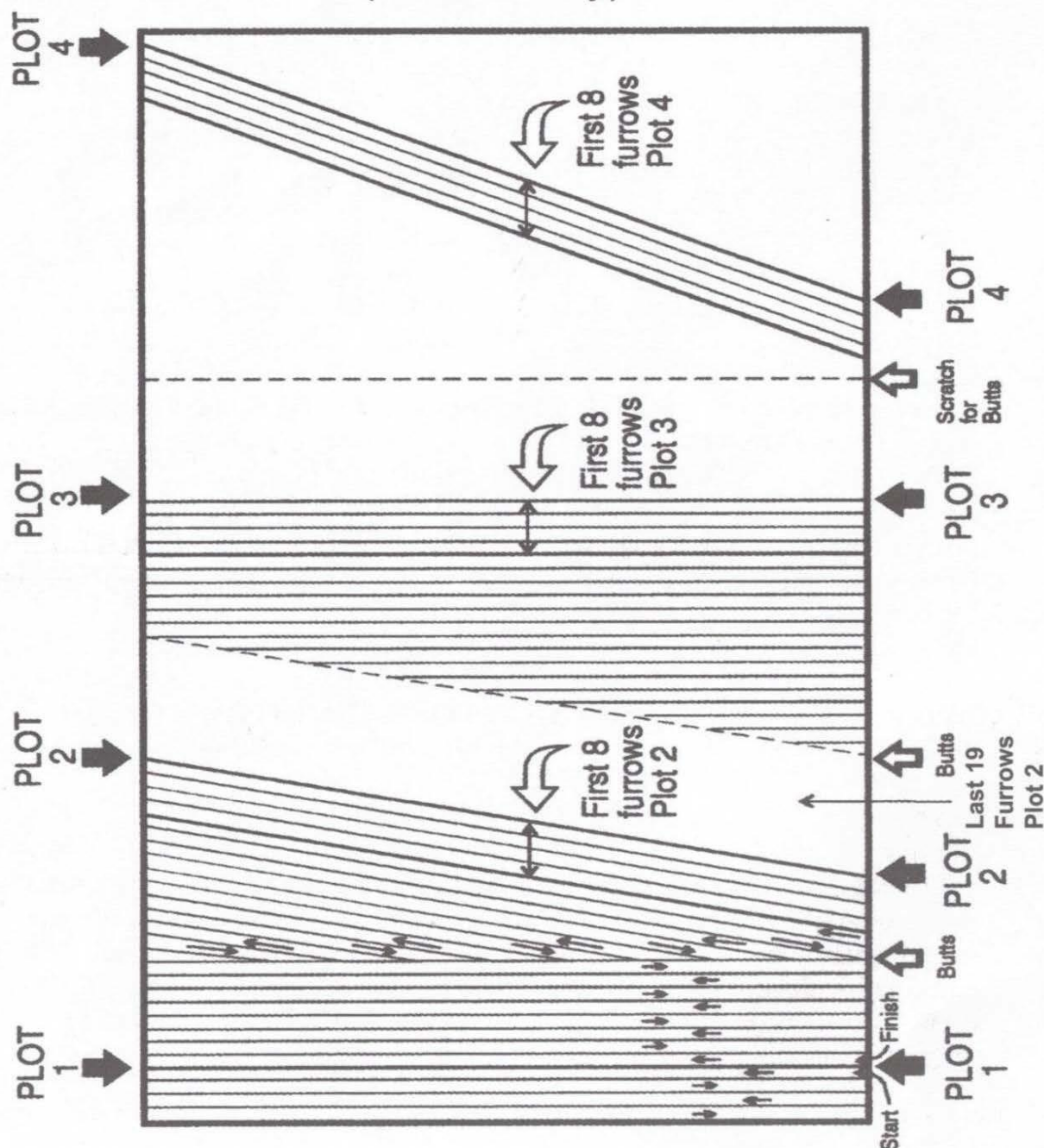

Allocation of Plots - Please note the draw will take place at 6pm on Wednesday 26th August 2026 to determine the order of plots.

All competitors are asked to declare by 8.45am.

Competitors in classes 1, 2, 3 & 4 to set up a cop and show six top furrows, all cops must be opened and will be judged at 10.00am – Land to be ploughed not less than 5” deep.

Competitors in classes 5, 6, 7 and 8 must make a single opening split for judging at 10.00am. Rolling of Opening split will **NOT** be allowed.

Land to be ploughed not less than 7” and not more than 10” deep.

Competitors must set out and plough 6/8 furrows from their own number by 10.30am, then proceed to the higher number and complete his plot to his first furrow leaving **no ground unploughed.**

Tractor ploughmen to plough the acreage fixed by the Committee in four hours (9.30am to 1.30pm)

Any competitor not completing his ploughing by 1.30pm will lose points.

Plot width will be allocated according to size of plough.

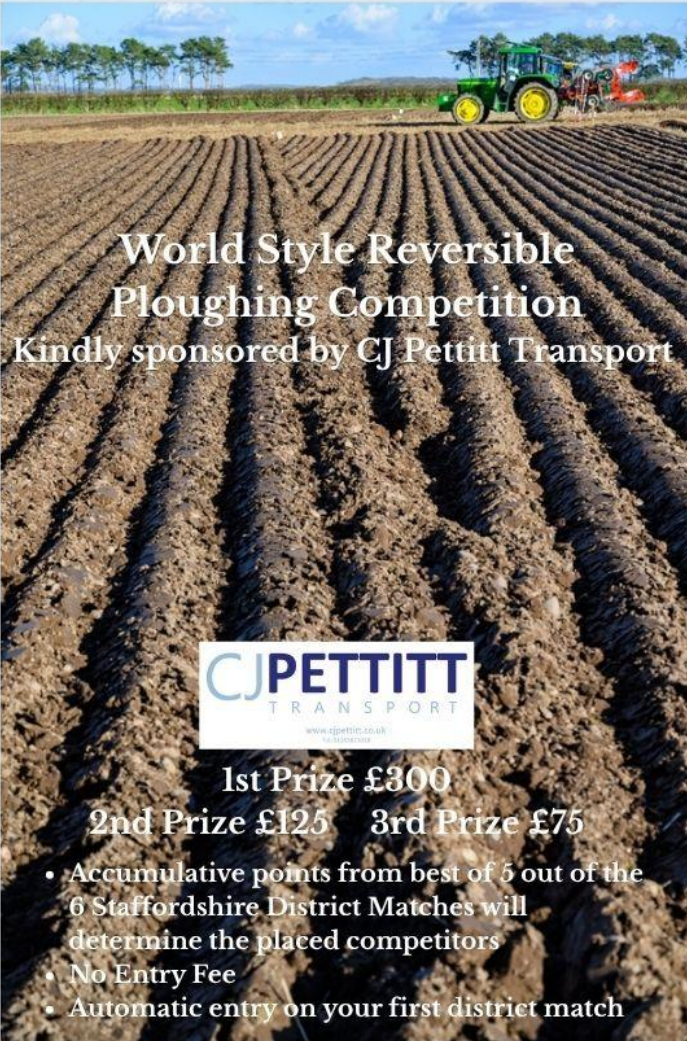

All competitors must comply with the following:-

CODE OF PRACTICE FOR HEDGE LAYING COMPETITION

Use of Chainsaws

Competitors must comply with Health and Safety Regulations.

In respect of the use of CHAINSAWS the following requirements are for all competitors:

1. The user should have sufficient length of experience or be able to show proof of training to a suitable standard for the type of work concerned (The need for adequate training for safety purposes IS a legal requirement).
2. When chainsaws are being used all competitors in the Hedge Laying Competition are required to wear full Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) – this must include eye and ear protection, gloves, a hard hat, boots and chainsaw rated trousers.
3. Any competitor failing to wear full PPE when operating a chainsaw will be given a single verbal warning before being disqualified from continuing in the competition.
4. The Society has a duty of care to ensure that all competitors take all necessary precautions to protect themselves and others from harm. Moreover, as an event that is open to the public we have a responsibility to ensure that the highest standards of safety are both set and maintained.

In any case where the stewards feel that these requirements are not being complied with the competitor will be disqualified.

Entries for the competition are accepted on the understanding that all prospective competitors understand the above conditions and are agreeable to abide by them at all times.

In respect of the requirements regarding the use of chainsaws; in any case where a prospective competitor feels he/she cannot comply with these requirements, it should NOT deter him/her from entering if he/she DOES NOT intend to use a chainsaw.

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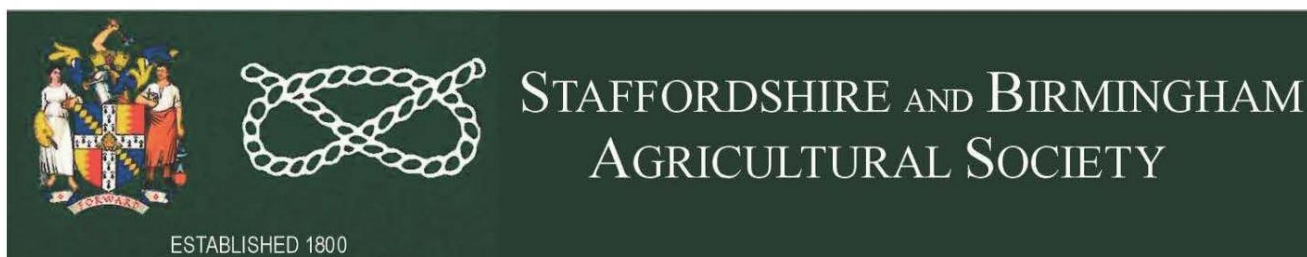

Burton District Bursary Awards

Open to anyone aged between 18 years and 40 years from Burton and the surrounding area.

Awards of up to £1000 will be awarded annually by the Burton District SBAS, the number awarded being dependant upon demand and available funding up to a maximum annual amount of £2500. The Burton District will reserve the right not to award any bursaries if it is deemed that no suitable applications have been received.

Application for awards initially will be by completion of a form that will require details of the educational event or training that the award is needed for. Short listed candidates may be required to attend an interview conducted by the Burton District Bursary committee.

Courses/events considered will include anything relating to farm based or diversification projects. Course may be practical, such as hedgelaying, sheep shearing through to technical computer courses or conferences. Mandatory course will not be eligible for this award

Details of the course/event will be required together with cost.

For compliance purposes payment receipt for the course/event will need to be submitted, along with evidence of attendance.

Successful applicants will be invited to the Burton District Annual Dinner held in October where the award will be acknowledged.
